Book Review

Create New Book Titles

Make a list of five titles that would make a better name for your book.

Travel Agent Challenge

Pretend you are a travel agent and want people to visit the place in the story.
Write a paragraph on what you would tell others.

Character Description

Draw a picture of a character from the story. Make sure you use all the detail that the book gives you.

Book Quiz

Make up a test for your book for another child to do with 10 or more questions.

Wordsearch/Crossword

Make up a wordsearch or crossword for the book.

What Happens Next?

Have a go at continuing the story after the end of the book. What might happen next?

Dictionary Challenge

Make a dictionary containing 10 or more difficult words from your book.

Create a Comic

Change the story (or part of it) into a comic strip.
